### World Wide Web in the West

The **Spring Internet World '95** is coming to the San Jose (Calif.) Convention Center April 10–13, promising to deliver everything you need to know about WWW, Mosaic, home pages, firewalls, and doing business on the net. After a day of tutorials, the conference begins Tuesday and is arranged in six tracks that emphasize technical, business, and social aspects of networking and the Internet. Thursday concludes with more tutorials.

### Unplugged Nets in the East

For those who prefer their networking wireless, there's **Network World Unplugged**, happening April 11–13 at the New York (City) Hilton. Billed as the "anywhere, anytime" computing conference and exposition, the show offers tutorials on mobile data and messaging, PCS, and remote LAN access. These are followed by two days of exhibits, plenary sessions, and a dual-track conference program covering application solutions and an integrators' forum.
